Oh, how I wish you were all here with me!

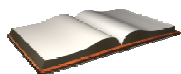
Why? It is such a fundamental aspect of being a United Methodist Church to understand that our church is not simply those of us who gather at that lovely spot in Aptos. For all major intents and purposes, our church *is* the Annual Conference – and we at Aptos are simply a part of it. (Think of it like a franchise) As a practical matter, decisions are made at this annual gathering that very directly affect our life in Aptos. How much should our

apportionments be? How much will your pastor be paid? Will we – as the church – make public statements in favor of, or opposing, such matters as gay rights or war.

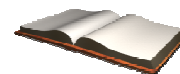

Disaster Preparedness Program Synopsis

We had a terrific potluck program with Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) and Red Cross speakers and great enthusiasm from about 50 people in attendance, including several neighbors. I asked all in attendance to fill out a feedback/future interest form and more than 30 participants responded. While I need some time to review this information in depth, I can say that about 15 to 20 folks want to participate in the Disaster Preparedness Team, 20 want more information on contacting or joining a neighborhood CERT, and 15 to 20 expressed interest in additional training. We had several church members ask for help, so we will need to organize some help teams later this summer.

We have a lot of raw positive energy, and we now need to ponder the next steps. Clearly we have a lot of interest beyond our core UMM team. I believe we may need a Disaster Prep Steering Committee of several in UMM with the church willing to take leadership to organize and capture the volunteer spirit. PLEASE BE THINKING ABOUT HOW YOU CAN JUMP IN TO COORDINATE A PIECE OF THIS PROJECT. I will stay involved and do one or more of the coordinating tasks, but this project will only grow to its potential if others get fully involved in leading key project areas. A few of the possible project areas (if we have volunteers to lead an approved plan) include:

- Forming a steering committee which includes church-wide representatives from those interested.
- Encouraging the formation of a CERT in our neighborhood.
- Building a database from church records showing neighborhood clusters of our members.
- Developing calling trees, a buddy system or another process to check on members after a disaster.
- Organizing our 'help' teams to visit homes and help in disaster prep actions (only a few requests so far).
- Following-up coordination and information to connect interested members of our congregation with Red Cross training and CERT coordinators .
- Identifying someone to rev up information and interest in UMCOR/VIM and really keep the church informed and encourage participation.
- Do we have someone in the church who is or wants to become a certified Red Cross CPR/first aid instructor to do in-house classes?
- Do we need to organize another communication event in the Fall ? With neighbors? Hand out info kits at the rummage sale? After church one Sunday?

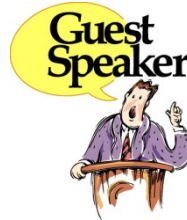

Write-Start Backpack Project – Will You Help This Year?

WHAT: A backpack packing party!

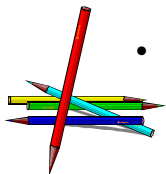
GOAL: to collect 100 new backpacks AND school supplies to fill them.

(Other items are needed as well, but our goal is to collect and fill 100 backpacks.)



This year the Christian Social Concerns Committee is dedicated to helping needy youth in our county. One way to do that is to participate again in the Write-Start Backpack Project for homeless and low-income students. Write-Start Backpack Project has supplied 18,500 backpacks to homeless & needy children since 1989, and our congregation has helped last year and in previous years.

Write-Start Backpack Project is the Santa Cruz County Office of Education’s annual campaign to supply homeless and needy children with backpacks filled with essential school supplies. Last year, through a partnership with Costco and thanks to community donations, they provided over 3,500 children with backpacks. This year the goal is to provide 4,000 backpacks. To make this possible, they are asking for donations of the following items:



- **New Backpacks:** Please purchase in dark, solid colors, medium or large sizes. Note: Royal blue or red backpacks cannot be accepted.

• **School Supplies**

We need NEW:

- two-inch ring binders
- binder paper
- colored pencils
- spiral notebooks
- pencils



- pens
- rulers
- 16 pack crayons
- calculators
- Spanish-English dictionaries



- **Santa Cruz Metro Bus Passes:** Children need transportation to school.
- **Gift Certificates:** We accept certificates for shoes or clothing — we do not have the facilities to accept used items.
- **Cash Donations:** Please make checks payable to SCCOE Students in Transition Program.
