# **Church and Society**

Here at Aptos United Methodist Church, we are a church that welcomes and celebrates pets. You could say that in our sanctuary, the hands and feet of God are accompanied by paw prints and wet noses. Did you know that there are some Methodist churches that have pet ministries? Let me tell you a little about that, and you can think about these ideas for our own church.

A pet ministry provides care, comfort, and connection for people and their pets, including grief and loss support, educational classes and resources, therapy dogs, community outreach, support of a pet food pantry, and a blessing of the animals. One such ministry is at Resurrection UMC in Leawood, Kansas. Linda Haney, co-founder of their pet ministry, brings her Labrador Retriever, Dance, to small groups at the church. When she and another woman proposed a pet ministry, seed money was provided to kick things off. Plus, the minister, Rev. Adam Hamilton, was starting a sermon series on God and dogs at the same time that the pet ministry was finding its legs.

Initially, the founders set up a table in the church narthex with signup sheets for those interested in pet ministry. When people would stop to talk to them, they would ask, "What's important to you? What would you like to see?" And one of the things that really came out, at almost every juncture, was "We need support for grief after the loss of a pet." People recognized that grieving a pet is different than grieving for a person, but that some kind of support when a pet dies would be very helpful.

As the ministry developed, it provided emotional and spiritual support for those who had lost their pets. Cards were sent, and space was given so that folks could talk about their loss. There was follow-up after a couple of months to see how the folks were doing because one thing they discovered is that people hang on to their grief about the loss of a pet for a long time.

The pet ministry also provides visits from therapy dogs. The dogs, certified through Canines4Christ, attend events at the church, anything from support groups for grief or Parkinson's, to Bible studies, Vacation Bible School, potlucks. They also get requests for visits to elderly members who are shut in, sick children, divorce recovery, things like that.







"There is something special about being with a dog when you're feeling sad, or anxious, or even happy," said Haney. "Just having the dogs there for 15 minutes or so levels that anxiety, levels that sadness a little bit," she said. "Some of the dogs — I have one like this — have a special, I think, divine connection, where they almost pull that negative energy out."

There are some things the pet ministry will not do, Haney said. "We don't pet sit, we don't provide somebody to come to your house. If we get requests sometimes for people that maybe have been injured, or they're elderly, can you come and walk my dog? We don't do that. We don't work with rescues and shelters directly. So we're not going to the Humane Society and volunteering there. We do refer people out there, but I think that's a request we do get sometimes where people think we can help them with their individual pet."

"One of the biggest things that we don't do is we are not a rescue," another added. "We do get a number of people who will reach out to us and say, 'I've got this pet that I need to ..., 'I need to find out what to do with ....' We can then refer them to a lot of different places."

Pet ministry can easily be adapted to other churches. What do you think? Is there more we could be doing here at Aptos UMC to provide grief and loss support for people and their pets? We are not as a big a church as Resurrection, but we have the people, the pets and the needs, so let's be creative in our thinking about how to make this a ministry here!




