## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Greetings Church Family,

Easter has come, but it's definitely not gone! We are in the middle of the seven week season that celebrates the resurrection of our Lord. This time of remembrance is particularly suitable for pondering our own new birth in Christ and how that regeneration transforms our living and our loving.

Recently we have been looking at the First Epistle of John asking ourselves, "How Shall We Live?". We touched on the themes of walking in the light, purifying in hope, and abiding in Christ. These illustrations serve to guide us in how to be witnesses to the kingdom, even as we wait for the fulfillment of the promise.

Next we move into the Gospel of John where we will explore the question, "How Shall We Love?". We will spend some time together, before God, contemplating the invitation to a life that leads with love. Of course, we need to do more than just contemplate; we need to love. We step out; we reach out; we invite and encourage; we lift up and help heal. And sometimes we get it wrong, and sometimes it isn't received in the spirit intended. But we keep at it. We keep loving. And the relocation of our children into a special place of their own in our sanctuary has fostered a feeling of inclusion. The common denominator in this resurrection is love: for God, for each other, and for all of creation.

I pray that you all embrace your own resurrection. This new birth we have been given is so we can in turn give life to others. Receive the nourishment that is God's grace, and grow abundantly in generosity and sharing the gifts we enjoy in Christ.

## **Church and Society**

April showers bring May flowers, as the saying goes, and together we are hoping that the sweet peas that the children planted on Earth Day Sunday in April are now reaching up towards the bright May sun! Likewise, the seeds for our community garden of organic, heirloom vegetables have been planted, and the sprouts are being tended and cared for in hopes of a bountiful harvest later in the season when we will have a potluck of pizza adorned with our homegrown vegetables. As a church family, we have embraced the theme of Common Ground: Cultivating Connections Between Our Faith, Our Food, and the Climate.

Healthy soil helps solve the climate crisis. Healthy soil leads to healthy humans and animals, healthy water, and a healthy climate. Did you know there are more microbes in a teaspoon of healthy soil than there are people on the planet? Food-growing practices that conserve or regenerate the soil support the health of these tiny creatures and the system they are part of. Some of these practices include no tilling or chemicals, using compost for fertilizer, and rotating diverse crops to avoid pests. Keeping the soil covered with growing plants feeds the microorganisms that build the carbon in the soil. These practices increase water retention, providing a buffer against drought and flooding.

Since we all purchase food, we all have the opportunity to influence how our food is grown. As a part of our commitment to cultivating connections between our faith, our food, and the climate, consider the above practices in your own gardens and consider purchasing your food from local growers who utilize these practices.

**Remember!** Remember who you are and Whose you are: You are a beloved child of God. The very first commandment God gave humanity was to care for creation (Genesis 1–2). In your approach to all things created by God and by humans, remember you are a caretaker. Let that sacred charge be your guide!


