Greetings Church Family,

On Easter Sunday, Josie Sayous was baptized and Vicki Cull was received into membership.



Church and Society

April in our area means spring has fully sprung. The air is milder, the trees are blossoming, and gardens are being planted. It's the perfect month for Earth Day, and this year's **Earth Day** will be celebrated on **April 22**. Through our church's association with Interfaith Power and Light (IPL), we are joining in to celebrate this year's theme of **Common Ground: Cultivating Connections Between Our Faith, Our Food, and the Climate.**

Food is an important part of our faith traditions - we use it to express our connection to each other, to the earth, and to our spirituality. Our traditions have certain beliefs about food, we use food symbolically in our liturgies and celebrate our community get-togethers with food. Our faith tradition calls us to care for the earth. So, how we grow our food is integral to the way we care for the earth and for each other as religious people.

Therefore, this year we are going to grow a garden! We have purchased a Pizza Garden Seed Kit from IPL that contains organic, heirloom, non-GMO seedlings to be planted in good soil and tended for the season. As we don't have enough space on our church grounds, we are asking members of the congregation to volunteer to plant a germinated seedling or two in their home gardens to support this project. **Please consider being one of our volunteers!** Embarking on the journey of cultivating a garden nourishes us physically with fresh, homegrown produce and serves as a spiritual reminder of our interconnectedness with all life.



Imagine introducing our children to the joy of coming together to plant, nurture, and harvest the bounty of a shared garden! Beyond strengthening community ties, tending to the earth promotes sustainable practices, demonstrating environmental care. On **Sunday, April 21 (the day before Earth Day) we will have our community's children plant some seedlings during the Children's time**, with Mike Proffitt supervising their efforts. Pastor will lead us in a blessing and songs to celebrate this occasion. Parents and grandparents, please bring your children to this special service!

Most fun will be the harvesting of this multi-participant garden later in the year, which will yield all the vegetables necessary to make pizzas! We plan to have a pizza potluck party in late summer to celebrate the harvest! We encourage everyone to support this endeavor and then come on the designated Sunday (yet to be determined) to enjoy the homemade pizza adorned with our very own vegetables!

Village Santa Cruz County is a non-profit, grassroots membership organization that seeks to help Santa Cruz city and county residents to network with one another to help each other out through all the transitions of aging. A local Aptos subgroup of Village Santa Cruz County will meet at our church on the first **Wednesday of April, April 4 at 1 PM.** Come all ye seniors and join us! Several individuals from our congregation are already participating, and they are valuing the connections they are making with others in the community.

April also has a 5th Tuesday, so that means Habitat Lunches will need to be prepared on **Tuesday, April 30**. More information will be available later in the month. Please consider contributing to this important mission of providing healthy meals to the workers who are helping others to build affordable homes in our community. Finance Update

Greetings from the Finance Team. Our team met on Wednesday, March 20. Below is a summary of the topics we discussed and the decisions we made.

The first quarter of 2024. Both our finance secretary, Barbara Coy-Bulicz and accountant/auditor, Peggy Kaysen reported that income from pledges and other resources have come in as expected over these first months of the year. THANK YOU, for staying up to date on your pledges!

Our Trustee representatives Keri Swenson and Jana Daley talked about the Education building upgrade project. The good news is that the necessary renovations have been completed to the exterior (playground overhaul and new fencing) and interior (painting, deep cleaning and all new kitchen appliances, plus the <u>un</u>anticipated major upgrade to the fire alarm system). Trustees applied for and received a \$25,000 grant from the United Methodist Union. This would have covered the cost of the project were it not for the required but unexpected upgrade to our fire alarm system, which more than doubled the cost. As a result of an appeal to our congregation for financial support to fill the gap, over \$14,200 was raised. THANK YOU! This still has left a \$22,000 shortfall which hopefully will be fulfilled with the approval of a second grant request to the United Methodist Union. Stay tuned.

Thank you for all of your generosity! You are such a giving group of people. Since the beginning of 2024, not only have you supported the appeal to close the gap on the Education building, you also gave to special Sunday offerings and other important causes. Here is a summary: United Methodist Student Day - \$407, Human Relations Day - \$301, Missionary Kathryn Parker - \$320.

Mike Sampson joins the finance team. In the February Tide I mentioned I will be stepping back as Finance Chair at the end of June and was looking for someone to take over the job. Mike Sampson has graciously agreed to join the committee and become the chair this summer. Mike comes with a wealth of knowledge and experience and has chaired many of our committees over the years, including finance chair prior to the tenure of Anne Scott. Thank you, Mike!
